Geoffrey Thyne is a registered professional geologist specializing in applications of geochemistry to earth systems. He started working in 1979 as a research geochemist at the Arco Oil and Gas in Plano, Texas. He returned to graduate school in 1986 at the University of Wyoming earning a PhD in 1991. Since then he has taught at California State University in Bakersfield and the Colorado School of Mines in Golden. His previous work has been recognized by the AAPG with the A.I. Levorson Award in 2006 for research on gas development in environmentally-sensitive areas. He has served on the National Research Council committee for beneficial uses of Coal Bed Methane produced

water (2008) and the U.S. EPA Scientific Advisory Board for the hydraulic fracturing study (2010). He was a senior research scientist at the Wyoming Enhanced Oil Recovery Institute from 2006 to 2012. Since leaving EORI he has worked as a consultant and is currently working on wettability modification to improve production for conventional and unconventional reservoirs.
