Lanier Nalley received a B.S. degree in agricultural and development economics with minors in development studies and European history from The Ohio State University. He received his M.S. degree in agricultural economics from Mississippi State focusing his research on experimental auctions. He earned his Ph.D. from Kansas State University in 2007 in agricultural economics with an emphasis on international policy. While at Kansas State he conducted research at the International Maize and Wheat Improvement Center (CIMMYT), in Mexico City, on the welfare analysis of international public wheat breeding. He also served as a volunteer in Ghana surveying women's cooperatives in regards to microfinance loans. Dr Nalley has worked with the International Institute of Tropical Agriculture (IITA) in Accra, Ghana and International Rice Research Institute in Los Banos, Philippines on international development related issues. Dr. Nalley's current research emphasis is on rice production, international

agricultural policy, the economics of plant genetics, and international development.
